A Great Horned Owl has been following you and wants to eat you! Hide under some tree bark until he flies away. You can **sneak ahead three spaces.**



Scientists capture you for research. They put a light identification band around your leg and set you free. You can **move ahead four spaces.**



You get tangled in fishing line. You are weak from hunger. A wildlife management officer cuts the line, feeds you, and then sets you free. You can **move ahead three spaces.**



You find a bat house that someone has built for shelter. **Skip one turn so you can take a nap.**



You escape being captured by a predator, but slightly sprain your handwing. **Move back two spaces to get well.**



It is raining so hard outside that you don't want to fly in this rainstorm. Wrap your wings around yourself while you wait for the weather to clear and **skip one turn.**



Someone planted a colorful bat garden in their backyard. You stop to eat the bountiful food and then you **move two spaces forward.**



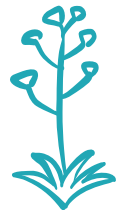
Strong winds throw you off course. You must **move back one space** to gather your strength.

You stopped to drink some nectar which pollinated another flower. **Move forward two spaces.**



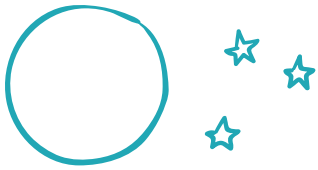
Ouch! You accidentally flew into a wind turbine because you thought it was a tree. Unfortunately, you died. Please **move back to the "Start" space.**



You reach an abandoned mine to roost for the winter, but it has caved in. You look for another place. You find another spot to stay until spring. You may **move forward three spaces.**



Biologists have caught you in their net. They put a transmitter on your back so they can learn more about your migration pattern. Please **move forward two spaces.**



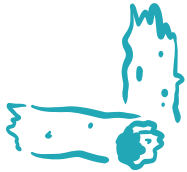
You have been flying all day and are ready to rest. It is a full moon and predators will be out hunting for food. You decide to stay in your roost for the night. **Move forward one space.**



You accidentally fly into a house. You panic and fly around in circles. Finally, the people open a door for you to fly out. You succeed and find your way out of the house. **Move forward one space.**



Your usual cave is now open to human visitors. The visitors are loud and scare when you are trying to rest. You leave and need to find a new place to roost. **Move forward two spaces.**



Many old dead trees have been cut down and left to rot. There are places in the trees for roosting. You spend a few days resting and eating here during migration. **Skip one turn to rest and eat.**



You fly near a hatch of moths and swoop down to eat them. You fill your stomach and then roost for a few hours before continuing your migration. You may **move forward four spaces.**



A storm has left puddles of water in a desert area of Texas. Take a few drinks and then **move forward one space.**
